Dear Friends,

During a turbulent year in the United States, the Paul Simon Public Policy Institute continued to support democracy and promote civility. We advocated for effective and visionary public policies and encouraged students to consider careers in public affairs. The Institute supported students with special programs, scholarships, internships, work opportunities, and awards. We hosted compelling programs and distinguished speakers, illuminating critical issues, stimulating dialogue, and elevating the Institute and Southern Illinois University.

During the course of the year, we invited excellent speakers to campus, including Scott Simon, NPR's Weekend Edition Saturday host, John Rogers, founder and Co-CEO of Ariel Investments, Tony McCombie, Illinois House Republican Leader, Samuel Freedman, professor at Columbia Journalism School, and John Palfrey, president of the MacArthur Foundation.

The Institute organized a special political roundtable in Chicago on the first day of the Democratic Convention with former Illinois congressman and U.S. transportation secretary Ray LaHood, former Illinois congresswoman Cheri Bustos, and Carl Hulse, chief Washington correspondent of the New York Times.

Three of our signature programs demonstrated our enduring commitment to Illinois: the Renewing Illinois Summit for college and university students, the Paul Simon-Jim Edgar Award for statesmanship in state and local government in Illinois, and the Paul Simon Democracy Prize for students who develop projects to promote democracy in their communities.

The Institute hosted exceptional virtual events last year which significantly expanded our audience and our reach. We enjoyed conversations with John Hamre, president of the Center for Strategic and International Studies, Brian Rosenberg, former president of Macalester College, Evelyn Farkas, executive director of the McCain Institute, John Palfrey, president of the MacArthur Foundation, Louise Richardson, president of the Carnegie Corporation of New York, Norm Ornstein, political analyst at the American Enterprise Institute, Bill Hoagland, senior vice president of the Bipartisan Policy Center, Fanta Aw, executive director of NAFSA: Association of International Educators, Kai Bird, Pulitzer Prize-winning biographer, Carla Martinez Machain, professor at the University of Buffalo, Lindsey Cormack, professor at Stevens Institute of Technology, and Jan Eliasson, former UN deputy secretary-general.

McCombie, the first woman to serve as House Republican leader in the state, joined Institute Director Shaw to discuss the Republican Party's policy agenda and reviewed the issues her party believed would be crucial for success in the 2024 Illinois general elections.


UNDERSTANDING OUR NEW WORLD







PAUL SIMON-JIM EDGAR STATESMANSHIP AWARD

FORMER OTTAWA MAYOR ROBERT ESCHBACH IS RECIPIENT OF SIMON-EDGAR AWARD

Former Ottawa Mayor Robert Eschbach is the recipient of the 2024 Paul Simon-Jim Edgar Statesmanship Award for his more than two decades of visionary, practical and effective leadership as mayor and his continuing work to make his community strong, vibrant and optimistic.

Eschbach served as mayor of Ottawa, Illinois, from 1999 to 2019.

Eschbach is a native of Ottawa. He attended Illinois Valley College and graduated from Illinois State University. He earned a law degree from the University of Illinois in Urbana-Champaign.

A native of Ottawa, Eschbach returned to his hometown after receiving his law degree from the University of Illinois. He volunteered on projects related to environmental protection, historic preservation, and downtown and neighborhood revitalization.

He served on the city's plan commission, zoning board and historic preservation commission before he was elected mayor in 1999.

When he became mayor, Ottawa was struggling with job loss and a badly deteriorating downtown. Eschbach helped draft a comprehensive plan in 1999, the first in Ottawa's history, and later submitted a revised plan that won the 2016 American Planning Association's Daniel Burnham Award for Outstanding Comprehensive Plan. He also worked with colleagues on a floodplain plan that earned national awards.

He led a successful citywide effort to attract jobs, revitalize downtown, develop the riverfront, beautify the city and sponsor a wide array of festivals and cultural events.

The annual Simon-Edgar Statesmanship Award is presented to an elected state or local government official in Illinois who has demonstrated a pattern of public service characterized by vision, courage, compassion, effectiveness, civility, and bipartisanship.

RENEWING ILLINOIS SUMMIT



The Paul Simon Public Policy Institute hosted our third Renewing Illinois Summit on SIU's campus from October 24-25. The Summit drew over 70 students from 10 different institutions and included presentations by SIU System President Dan Mahony, Illinois State Representative Carol Ammons, former Illinois State Historian Sam Wheeler and author Jim Nowlan. Former Illinois Governor Jim Edgar delivered the keynote address, describing his career in politics and analyzing the current political environment. President Mahony outlined the challenges confronting colleges and universities in Illinois. Representative Ammons described her proposal to overhaul higher education financing in Illinois. Historian Wheeler presented an informative and entertaining history of Illinois's state song. Carley Jo Goggans, an SIU graduate student, performed a stirring rendition of "Illinois".

PAUL SIMON DEMOCRACY PRIZE

The Institute presented four \$5,000 awards as part of the annual Paul Simon Democracy Prize in 2024. The recipients were current students from Illinois colleges and universities, recognized for designing and implementing projects aimed at revitalizing democracy in their communities.

2024 Paul Simon Democracy Prize Winners:













VanKevia Garner of Southern Illinois University has developed a podcast series to explore the restoration of voting rights for people with criminal records and encourage civic engagement among previously incarcerated people.

Lylee Gibbs of Southern Illinois University continues to help develop the Saluki Local Reporting Lab at SIU. Her project focuses on telling local news stories in Southern Illinois, specifically in Alexander County, which has the lowest median income in Illinois.

Keara Gray of Illinois State University developed The Young Sovereign Citizens Project, which organizes community conversations on current civic issues.

Saqlain Khurshid and Lyndsay Jones of Illinois State University developed an analytic model to predict voting probability among ISU students. The model will target students who are less likely to vote with relevant information via an AI-driven charbot on ISU's Center for Civic Engagement website.

Women's Civic Day, one of the flagship initiatives of the Paul Simon Public Policy Institute, empowers and inspires the next generation of women leaders by connecting Southern Illinois University students with the heart of Illinois state government. Held annually at the Illinois State Capitol in Springfield and led by Dr. Linda Baker, this event highlights the achievements of women in public service, celebrating the leadership and impact of women legislators, public officials, and community advocates.

Designed to cultivate leadership skills and encourage greater civic engagement, the program provides participants with opportunities to engage with influential speakers, including state lawmakers, senior public sector leaders, and prominent community organizers. Through these interactions, students gain invaluable insights into the legislative process, build professional networks, and are inspired to pursue careers in public policy and leadership.


